Based on the May 2010 enrollment report, there are 128 students enrolled at Waterville Elementary School with an ethnic composition of:

- African American: 0.8%
- American Indian/Alaskan Native: 4.1%
- Asian/Pacific Islander: 1.7%
- Caucasian: 89.3%
- Hispanic: 4.1%

Our school is a neighborhood school with one teacher for each of the 7 grade levels Kindergarten through 6th grade. Our size allows all teachers to know all students and their families and contributes to a friendly, welcoming environment where all students are accepted for who they are and recognized for the leadership qualities they bring to our school community. Our staff believes in teaching strong foundational skills in reading, math, writing, science and social studies. Students are involved in the “Literate About Biodiversity” integrated science/reading/technology/writing/art/presentation skill program in Kindergarten through 6th grade.

This gives our students the opportunity to use their skills in a real world application while being “citizen scientists” and becoming stewards of their school, community, and environment.

“**The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People**” is helping us all recognize, celebrate and challenge everyone’s special talents – both adults and students. Students are taking on leadership roles in their school and helping it become a better place to grow and learn in. Adults and students are learning together how to treat each other, how to inspire and be inspired, and how to help each other be the best they can be!

We believe in, teach, model and expect students to follow three basic behavior guidelines: **be safe, be kind, and be responsible**. Students learn classroom and common area behavior expectations and are held accountable through our “Time to Teach” behavior program.

MEASUREMENTS OF STUDENT PROGRESS: Students in grades 3-6 are required to take an annual state assessment, the MSP. The scores represent the percent of students meeting the Measurements of Student Progress (MSP) standards.
