### 2010-11 School Facts:

Based on the OSPI School Report Card, there are 160 students enrolled at Waterville Junior/Senior High School with an ethnic composition of:

- American Indian/Alaskan Native: 1.2%
- Caucasian: 69.5%
- Hispanic: 25%
- Two or More Races: 4.2%

### Student Demographics:

- Male students: 63.5%
- Female students: 36.5%
- Student On Time Graduation Rate: 83.2%
- Students who qualify for free or reduced price meals: 60.0%
- Students who qualify for Special Education: 15.6%

All of our teachers and instructional para-professionals are highly qualified. Based on 2010-11 student achievement data, Waterville Junior/Senior High is in Step 3 in Math for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) under the federal No Child Left Behind Act.

We are a small school with a lot to offer! Our school is a community school with one teacher for most junior/senior high subject areas. Our size allows all teachers to know all students and their families and contributes to a friendly, welcoming environment where all students are accepted for who they are and recognized for the leadership qualities they bring to our school community. Our staff believes in teaching strong foundational skills in reading, math, writing, science and social studies and meets student needs by offering intervention courses in reading and math to students who are in need. Rigor is highly encouraged at Waterville Junior/Senior High School as evidenced by our large number of AP course offerings and other high level course offerings. Students are involved in building strong leadership and teamwork skills through heavy participation in art, music, leadership class, athletics, industrial arts and other extracurricular activities.

**Navigation 101** is helping us prepare all graduates for life beyond high school. Our work in advisories allows teachers and students to learn life skills including budgeting, goal setting and planning and to develop career and college readiness. Waterville graduates are ready to meet the changing world around them, and in fact, are ready to lead that changing world.

We believe in developing student responsibility and accountability through allowing student voice in their school. Students who graduate from Waterville Junior/Senior High are **citizens, learners, and leaders.**

**MEASUREMENTS OF STUDENT PROGRESS:** Students in grades 7 and 8 are required to take an annual state assessment, the MSP. Students in grade 10 are required to take the High School Proficiency Exam (HSPE). In the 2010-2011 school year, students enrolled in high school math courses began taking mathematics End of Course Exams (EOC). The scores below represent the percent of students meeting the Measurements of Student Progress (MSP), High School Proficiency Exam (HSPE) and End of Course (EOC) Exam standards.
